Commercial Marine Dealer License (CMDL) General Terms and Conditions

The licensee refers to any person and/or business issued a Commercial Marine Dealer License (CMDL) pursuant to section 13-74-45, Hawaii Administrative Rules. The CMDL authorizes the licensee to obtain marine life directly from a valid commercial marine licensee.

I understand that:

- 1. I must provide true, complete, and accurate information on any license application or any report that I am required to submit.
- 2. It is unlawful to purchase marine life unless I have first obtained a valid CMDL.
- 3. I may purchase marine life only from valid commercial marine licensees or from other validly licensed commercial marine dealers.
- 4. If purchasing regulated marine life, I must have the proper valid licenses, permits, or registrations to do so. If I am unsure, I will contact the DLNR.
- 5. I must pay an annual CMDL fee of \$100. I am responsible for renewing my CMDL even without notification from the DLNR. A duplicate license fee is \$10.
- 6. A single CMDL is issued to each market outlet and is non-transferrable. Only employees on official business may use the CMDL. The CMDL may not be used for personal use.
- 7. If the business changes location, closes, name, ownership, etc. I must contact the DLNR for further guidance.
- 8. I must make and issue receipts of all transactions (purchase, sale, receipt, transfer, or exchange).
- 9. I must keep all receipts on the premises for not less than twenty-four months after the transaction date.
- 10. I must show receipts upon the demand of any officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State.
- 11. I must allow inspections upon the demand of any officer authorized to enforce the laws of the State.
- 12. I am required to file weekly dealer reports with the State pursuant to section 13-74-46, Hawaii Administrative Rules.
- 13. I must ensure, to the best of my ability, that all marine life obtained from commercial marine licensees has been taken in compliance with state and local laws, especially if the marine life is obtained from another island.
- 14. The State, or its agents, shall not be liable for any personal injury, death or property damage resulting from any action or activity authorized by this license.
